**SKI TIP.** Dine Rocky Mountain style at our Ski Tip Restaurant. We offer food, beer, wine and a stunning view of the southern Rockies. (Location at the Summit)

**SKI CHALET.** Dining at our Ski Chalet has the super view of blue & gold chairlifts, views of the ski and snowboard classes. (Cafeteria Style)

**LIFTHOUSE RESTAURANT & BAR.** Gather here for fun and spirits. Every Saturday night, watch the torchlight parade from the deck. Open daily from 11:00 am.

### SKI SCHOOL & SNOWBOARDING.

Take a lesson from the pros. Beginner through advanced lessons. Inquire at the Ski School desk downstairs Ski Chalet.

**RESPONSIBILITY CODE.** There are elements of risk in skiing that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. **1.** Always stay in control and able to stop or avoid other people or objects. **2.** People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them. **3.** You must not stop where you obstruct a trail, or are not visible from above. **4.** Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others. **5.** Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment. **6.** Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas. **7.** Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

**KNOW THE CODE.** It's your responsibility. This is a partial list. Be safety conscious. Be advised that all fencing, equipment covers, signage, ropes and other marking devices are in place to inform you and to indicate a potential obstacle or hazard. These markings will not protect you from injury. It is your responsibility to stay away from marked areas.

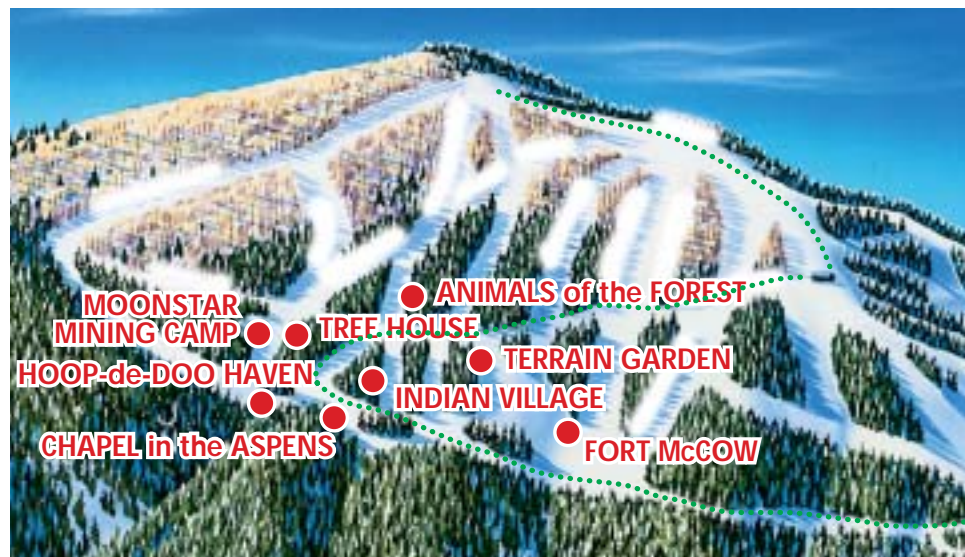
**Ski Patrol.** Ski Patrol personnel are available at the Chalet, the Ski Tip Restaurant, bottom of Red Chairlift and on the mountain for information and medical assistance. They are identified by their red jackets with crosses on the backs. If you need a Ski Patroller, ask any of the Red River Ski Area employees and they will be happy to locate one for you.

**Torchlight Parade.** One of the highlights of a vacation at Red River is the Torchlight Parade. Visible from most locations in town, the Torchlight Parade is held on "The Face" at the bottom of the Red Chairlift every Saturday and on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve at 7:00 p.m.

**Racing.** Nastar® Races are held on the "Race Course" every Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Based on the national handicap system, Nastar® gives each racer an opportunity to win a bronze, silver or gold medal and qualify for the National Nastar® race. Fun-Runs are also available. Registration is at the top of the race course adjacent to the Pony Express unloading station on the Copper Chairlift. The race course is designated by the Nastar® symbol on the trail map.

**Kids' Races** sponsored by Coca-Cola® are held on Gold Rush Hill in front of the Ski Lodge every Saturday from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The race is free for children 12 and under. Registration at the top of the race course on Gold Rush Hill by the Ski Lodge. Every racer receives a free Coca-Cola® and prizes are awarded according to age category.
